Unit 5: Jesus Is with Us on Our Way

Before You Begin

Read **A Letter Home**, found on page 178 of the Student Book. Decide how or whether you will experience the media for this unit and chapter using a web-enabled smartphone or tablet.

- 1. Familiarize yourself with the Word to Know for Chapter 20: sacrament.
- 2. Have available colored pencils, crayons, or markers and, optionally, one-half or one-fourth of a sheet of cardstock.

Page 177 Unit Opener

Invite your child to turn to page 177. Have your child read aloud the title of the unit, **Jesus Is with Us on Our Way**, and then find the Scripture verse at the bottom of the page. Have your child read aloud the Scripture verse. Say: *Here Jesus is giving instructions to the Apostles.* Talk about how these are also instructions to both of you and all who follow Jesus.

Point out the pictures on the page: a font of holy water; items pertaining to the Eucharist—a chalice, host, grapes, and wheat; and people leaving a church after attending Mass. Invite your child to share his or her impressions of these pictures. Say: *When we arrive at the church for Mass, we bless ourselves with holy water. At the culmination of the Mass, we receive the Eucharist. Then we are sent into the world to "make disciples of all nations"*—to glorify the Lord by our lives.

If you wish, scan the QR code in the lower-right-hand corner of the page using a handheld, web-enabled device to experience the media.

Page 179 Chapter 20: God Shares the Wondrous Life of Grace

Have your child read aloud the chapter title, **God Shares the Wondrous Life of Grace**, on page 179.

Jesus Brings Us a Share in God's Life

Take turns reading aloud with your child **Jesus Brings Us a Share in God's Life.** Say: *You know that I never stop loving you. Remember also that God never stops loving you.* Have your child complete the activity **God's Plan.** Then have him or her read aloud the correctly completed sentences.

If you wish, scan the QR code at the top of the page using a handheld, web-enabled device to experience the media.

Page 180 We Receive the Life of Grace in Baptism

Have your child read aloud the paragraph above the Scripture in **We Receive the Life of Grace in Baptism** on page 180. Call attention to the picture of Jesus with Nicodemus late at night. Then take turns reading the Scripture passage from John 3:2–5. You might read the passage as a dialogue, with one of you reading what Nicodemus says and the other what Jesus says.

Read aloud to your child the paragraph following the Scripture. Then have your child read aloud the rest of the page.

Page 181 Baptism Is a Sacrament

Take turns reading aloud with your child **Baptism Is a Sacrament** on page 133. Ask your child to close his or her eyes and remember his or her Baptism (if he or she was old enough to remember) or imagine his or her Baptism as you reread aloud the first two paragraphs, pausing after the first.

Pages 181–183 We Are Headed for Heaven

Take turns reading aloud with your child the paragraphs and Scripture of **We Are Headed for Heaven** on page 181. Call attention to the word *sacrament* that appears in blue. Have your child read aloud its definition in the **Word to Know** box. Say: *As you receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, remember that they are bringing you closer to God and to heaven.*

Have your child read aloud the directions and complete the activity **Living a Life of Grace** on page 182. Invite your child to read his or her responses to you.

Have your child close his or her eyes as you read aloud **A Moment with Jesus.** Allow your child a moment of silent prayer.

Have your child read aloud the directions to the activity **The Beauty of Baptism** on page 183. Have your child write the words in the acrostic and then read aloud to you his or her completed sentences.

Have your child read aloud the directions to the activity **God Shares His Life.** Then have him or her name the sacrament shown in each picture.

Chapter 20 Review

Help your child complete the **Chapter Review** on page 184. Have him or her read aloud the directions to the activity **Celebrating Baptism**. Discuss whom you and your child may know who has been baptized recently. Have your child write and draw a card for that person. If you wish, you may have your child make a card on a separate piece of cardstock to actually give or send to the person or his or her family. Review the **Word to Know** in this chapter. Discuss the question under **We Remember**. Pray together **We Respond**. Have your child read aloud the directions for **Your Turn**. Have your child recall your discussion of Baptism on page 181 to help in imagining his or her Baptism.

If you wish, have your child undertake the **Interactive Chapter Review** by scanning the QR code on page 184.

Complete the Families in Mission pages with your child.

SCRIPTURE

Read aloud the text and the Scripture in the sidebar on page 185. Say: *Paul reminds us that Baptism brings us together as God's family.*

KNOW AND PROCLAIM

Read aloud the **Know and Proclaim** text and the chart. Say: *In response to Adam and Eve's sin, God provides us a path to salvation—to the joy of a life with him in heaven.*

TEST YOUR CATHOLIC KNOWLEDGE

Read aloud the question and possible answers in **Test Your Catholic Knowledge.** Have your child answer the question. [ANSWER: help us on our way to heaven.] Say: *As you receive sacraments, remember that they are helping you on your way to heaven.*

A CATHOLIC TO KNOW

Read aloud **A Catholic to Know** on page 186. Discuss how you and your child do works of charity through your parish.

WITNESS AND SHARE

Read aloud the **Witness and Share** introductory text. Then read aloud each faith statement in **My Way to Faith**, pausing after each one for reflection.

SHARE YOUR FAITH

Have your child read aloud the directions to **Share Your Faith**. Say: *Our baptismal promises are to reject Satan and sin and to believe in God and in Jesus Our Savior*. Have your child complete the activity by stating some ways he or she will do these things. Invite your child to share what he or she has written.

Chapter 21

Page 187 Chapter 21: The Holy Spirit Lives Within Us Before You Begin

- 1. Familiarize yourself with the **Words to Know** for this chapter: *temptation, personal sin,* and *conscience.*
- 2. Decide how or whether you will experience the media for this chapter using a web-enabled smartphone or tablet.

Jesus Is the Way to Eternal Life

Have your child read aloud the chapter title on page 187, The Holy Spirit Lives Within Us.

Take turns reading aloud with your child the paragraphs and Scripture of Jesus Is the Way to Eternal Life.

Call your child's attention to the illustration at the bottom of the page. Together find clues that the man in this picture is rich. These include his clothing, jewelry, and the bag of money he is holding.

Discuss the dilemma the man faced: how it would feel to be asked to give up everything you have. Recall the parables of the buried treasure and the priceless pearl that your child learned about previously. Say: *The rich man felt sadness about what Jesus told him, but these two parables express the true joy we find in giving up everything to serve God.*

Have your child read aloud the Scripture in the **God's Word** feature. Talk about how this passage reinforces the message of the parable of the rich man: we devote ourselves to God, not to the things we own or the money we have.

Page 188 The Holy Spirit Is Our Helper

Have your child read aloud the first two paragraphs of **The Holy Spirit Is Our Helper** on page 188. Read aloud the third paragraph to your child.

Read aloud to your child the directions to the activity **Guided by the Spirit.** Give your child a moment to choose one of the gifts on the candles. Ask your child which gift he or she chose and why. Share with your child ways you have observed him or her with that gift. Then have your child write his or her prayer and then read it aloud to you.

Page 189 The Holy Spirit Leads Us to Do Good

Read aloud the first sentence in **The Holy Spirit Leads Us to Do Good** on page 189. Have your child read aloud the Scripture. Say: *Let's imagine ourselves looking directly on the glory of the Lord with unveiled face—meaning with nothing between us and his glory.* Close your eyes and have your child close his or her eyes, and engage together this silent, imaginative prayer.

Read aloud to your child the paragraph about Dominic Savio.

Read aloud the first sentence in **A Moment with Jesus.** Then take turns praying aloud the prayer, with one of you reading the verse parts and the other the response parts.

Read aloud to your child the directions to the activity **Pray to the Holy Spirit.** Invite your child to pray aloud for you his or her prayer.

Page 190 The Holy Spirit Helps Us Avoid Evil

Have your child read aloud the first paragraph of **The Holy Spirit Helps Us Avoid Evil** on page 190. Point out the terms *temptation* and *personal sin* that appear in blue. Have your child read aloud their definitions in the **Words to Know** box. Then have your child read aloud the next two paragraphs. Take turns reading aloud the Fruits of the Holy Spirit in the box. Have each of you choose one of these and think of an example of a time when you have been filled with that fruit. Describe your experiences to each other.

If you wish, scan the QR code in the lower-right-hand corner of the page using a handheld, web-enabled device to experience the media.

Pages 190-191 The Holy Spirit Helps Us Form Our Conscience

Have your child read aloud **The Holy Spirit Helps Us Form Our Conscience.** Have your child find and point to the word *conscience* that appears in blue and read aloud its definition in the **Words to Know** box.

Have your child complete the activities on page 191, **The Holy Spirit, Our Friend** and **The Holy Spirit and Me.** Check your child's responses to the first activity, then give him or her time to write a story. Make sure your child has given his or her story a title. Invite your child to read aloud his or her story to you. Affirm what your child has written and thank him or her for sharing it with you.

Page 192 Chapter 21 Review

Help your child complete the **Chapter Review** on page 192. Discuss the questions under **We Remember**. Review the **Words to Know** in this chapter. Pray together **We Respond** by having one of you pray the verse and the other the response. Have your child read aloud the directions for **Your Turn**. Give him or her time to write his or her response.

If you wish, have your child undertake the **Interactive Chapter Review** by scanning the QR code on page 192.

Pages 193–194 Families in Mission

Complete the Families in Mission pages with your child.

SCRIPTURE

Read aloud the text and the Scripture in the sidebar on page 193. Say: *When Jesus told the Apostles about the Holy Spirit that would come to them, he called the Spirit "the Advocate."*

KNOW AND PROCLAIM

Read aloud the **Know and Proclaim** text and the chart. Say: *To serve God, we share what we have and we share our gifts.*

TEST YOUR CATHOLIC KNOWLEDGE

Read aloud the question and possible answers in **Test Your Catholic Knowledge.** Have your child answer the question. [ANSWER: avoid sin.] Say: *We can always count on the Holy Spirit.*

A CATHOLIC TO KNOW

Read aloud **A Catholic to Know** on page 194. Encourage your child to think about how your family can help others better understand what it means to you to be Catholic.

WITNESS AND SHARE

Read aloud the **Witness and Share** introductory text. Then read aloud each faith statement in **My Way to Faith**, pausing after each one for reflection.

SHARE YOUR FAITH

Read aloud the directions in **Share Your Faith** and have your child complete the activity. During the week, help your child put the items in his or her list into action in your home.

Pray a prayer from the inside front or back cover of the Student Book to bring the chapter to a close.

Chapter 21

Page 195 Chapter 22: God Blesses Contrite Hearts Before You Begin

- 1. Familiarize yourself with the **Words to Know** for this chapter: *contrition* and *examination of conscience*.
- 2. Decide how or whether you will experience the media for this chapter using a web-enabled smartphone or tablet.

Peter Felt Contrition

Have your child read aloud the chapter title, **God Blesses Contrite Hearts**, on page 195. Call attention to the picture of the rooster on the page. Say: *This image is from a stainedglass window in which a story about Jesus and Peter is told. We will read this story and learn the part the rooster plays.*

Take turns reading aloud the paragraphs and Scripture in **Peter Felt Contrition**. Have your child find and point to the word *contrition* that appears in blue. Have him or her read aloud its definition in the **Word to Know** box. Say: *What part did the rooster play in this story?* (When Peter heard the rooster crow for the third time, he knew he had betrayed Jesus.)

Pages 196–197 Jesus Cares for All of Us

Read aloud to your child the first paragraph of **Jesus Cares for All of Us** on page 196. Take turns reading aloud to each other the four stories on pages 196–197. On each page is a parable Jesus told ("Two Men in the Temple" and "The Shepherd and His Lost Sheep") and a story about Jesus ("Jesus and the Woman at Simon's House" and "Jesus and Zacchaeus.") You might have the one who reads aloud the parable on page 196 read the story about Jesus on page 197, and vice versa. See if your child recognizes that the stories on page 196 represent people expressing honor and adoration for God and the ones on page 197 represent God reaching out to people. Our love for God and God's love for us are reciprocal.

Page 198 Do We Have a Disciple's Heart?

Have your child read aloud **Do We Have a Disciple's Heart?** on page 198. Call your child's attention to the term *examination of conscience* that appears in blue. Have him or her read aloud the definition in the **Word to Know** box.

Examination of Conscience

Have your child read aloud the nine steps in **Examination of Conscience**. Encourage him or her to do an examination of conscience each night.

Pray aloud together the Prayer of the Penitent.

If you wish, scan the QR code on the page using a handheld, web-enabled device to experience the media.

Page 199 Rich Soil of the Spirit

Read aloud to your child the paragraph in Rich Soil of the Spirit on page 199.

Have your child read aloud the Scripture in the **God's Word** feature. Ask: *Why would hearing and understanding God's Word result in such an abundance for us?* (because God's Word is the key to true happiness)

Have your child read aloud the directions to the activity **Planting in Rich Soil** and complete the activity. Have him or her explain to you how the words he or she chose from the word bank nourish the Kingdom of God within us.

Have your child close his or her eyes as you read aloud **A Moment with Jesus.** Allow him or her a moment to reflect on Jesus' words.

Page 200 Chapter 22 Review

Help your child complete the **Chapter Review** on page 200. Have your child read aloud the directions and complete the activity **Sin, Contrition, and Forgiveness.** Have your child read aloud his or her completed sentences. Review the **Words to Know** in this chapter. Discuss the question under **We Remember.** Pray together **We Respond.** Have your child read aloud the directions for **Your Turn** and complete his or her drawing. Invite your child to say something about his or her drawing.

If you wish, have your child undertake the **Interactive Chapter Review** by scanning the QR code on page 200.

Complete the Families in Mission pages with your child.

SCRIPTURE

Read aloud the text and the Scripture in the sidebar on page 201. Say: *Admitting our sins* to God enables us to walk in God's light.

KNOW AND PROCLAIM

Read aloud the **Know and Proclaim** text and the chart. Say: *The Holy Spirit guides us in our examination of conscience.*

TEST YOUR CATHOLIC KNOWLEDGE

Read aloud the question and possible answers in **Test Your Catholic Knowledge**. Have your child answer the question. [ANSWER: identify things in our life that might offend God] Say: *Doing an examination of conscience and then opening ourselves to God's love frees us to love one another.*

Have your child read aloud **A Catholic to Know** on page 202. Ask if your child ever thinks about helping younger children by reading to them or helping them with schoolwork.

SHARE YOUR FAITH

Have your child read aloud the directions in **Share Your Faith** and write his or her response. Help your child make a plan for your family to attend Reconciliation together.

Page 203 Chapter 23: God Forgives Us Before You Begin

- 1. Familiarize yourself with the Word to Know for this chapter: penance.
- 2. Decide how or whether you will experience the media for this chapter using a web-enabled smartphone or tablet.

Pages 203–204 The Lost Son

Have your child read aloud the chapter title on page 203, **God Forgives Us.** Take turns reading aloud the first three paragraphs of **The Lost Son**. Stop to discuss what has happened so far: the situation the young man is in and how he got there. Invite your child to share ideas as to what the young man should do.

Then continue by taking turns reading aloud the rest of the page. Have your child read aloud the Scripture in the **God's Word** feature. Discuss the rejoicing that occurs in your family when people have made up after an argument, or when someone has admitted that they said or did something wrong and apologized.

Have your child read aloud the directions to the activity **Time Line for the Parable of the Lost Son** on page 204. Have your child tell you what is shown in each picture and what it represents from the parable:

A pile of coins: The money the son asked for, which consisted of what he would inherit.

A pig: When the son ran out of money, he got a job taking care of pigs.

A group of friends having fun: At first, the young man spent his money and enjoyed himself.

The young man looking sad: He realized the wrong he had done and how it had hurt him and others.

The young man waving: The young man left home to go off on his own.

The young man and his father hugging: The father welcomed him back with love.

Have your child turn back to page 203 and reread the story silently. Then have him or her complete the activity by writing the number of the story part that goes with each picture.

Invite your child to respond to the parable. How did he or she like it? What did it make your child feel? What does your child think about it? Listen to and affirm his or her responses, and share your own if you wish.

Have your child close his or her eyes as you read aloud **A Moment with Jesus.** Allow your child a moment for silent, imaginative prayer.

If you wish, scan the QR code on the page using a handheld, web-enabled device to experience the media.

Page 205 The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation

Read aloud to your child The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation on page 205.

We Prepare for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation

Have your child read aloud We Prepare for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

Have your child read aloud the directions to the activity **Contrition Self-Portrait.** Allow time for your child to complete his or her drawing.

Pages 206-207 Celebrating the Sacrament

Read aloud to your child the first paragraph of **Celebrating the Sacrament** on page 206. Have your child read aloud **Steps in Individual Celebration.** Call attention to the word *penance* that appears in blue and have your child point to it. Have him or her read aloud the definition in the **Word to Know** box.

Have your child read aloud the directions to the activity **The Way to Peace** and complete the activity. When your child has finished, have him or her read aloud the completed sentences.

Page 208 Chapter 23 Review

Help your child complete the **Chapter Review** on page 208. Have him or her read aloud the directions to the activity **Inviting Peace**. Have your child complete the sentences and then the acrostic. Have your child read aloud his or her completed sentences. Review the **Word to Know** in this chapter. Discuss the question under **We Remember**. Pray together the psalm verse in **We Respond**. Have your child read aloud the directions for **Your Turn** and then write his or her response.

If you wish, have your child undertake the **Interactive Chapter Review** by scanning the QR code on page 208.

SHARE YOUR FAITH

Have your child read aloud the directions in **Share Your Faith** and complete the activity. Arrange a time when your child can share his or her prayer with the family.

Page 211 Chapter 24: God's Family Celebrates the Eucharist

Before You Begin

- 1. Familiarize yourself with the **Words to Know** for this chapter: *Blessed Sacrament, blessing, Liturgy of the Word, Epistles, Lectionary for Mass,* and *Homily.*
- 2. Have available drawing paper (optional) and crayons, colored pencils, or markers.
- 3. Decide how or whether you will experience the media for this chapter using a web-enabled smartphone or tablet.

The Mass Is a Meal in Memory of Jesus

Have your child read aloud the chapter title, **God's Family Celebrates the Eucharist**, on page 211.

Take turns reading aloud with your child the paragraphs and Scripture in **The Mass Is a Meal in Memory of Jesus.** Discuss with your child types of things you share with one another at your family meals. Examples are food, which family members may share by serving the person next to them and/or passing dishes around; highlights of family members' day; upcoming plans and requests; and thankfulness for being together and for the nourishment you receive. Ask: *What was shared at the Last Supper?* (Jesus shared with the Apostles his Body and Blood, the new covenant, and the promise of the forgiveness of sins.)

If you wish, scan the QR code at the top of the page using a handheld, web-enabled device to experience the media.

Page 212 The Mass Is a Sacrifice of Love

Have your child read aloud **The Mass Is a Sacrifice of Love** on page 212. Say: *At Mass, we join ourselves to Jesus' sacrifice and commit to helping carry out his work of love. To help us do that, Jesus teaches, nourishes, and strengthens us.*

Jesus Remains with Us

Take turns reading aloud Jesus Remains with Us. Call attention to the terms *Blessed Sacrament* and *blessing* that appear in blue. Have your child read aloud their definitions in the Words to Know box. Ask: *When we are apart from someone we love, whether for a short or a long time, we have reminders that they remain with us. What are some examples of such reminders?* (They may include things we carry with us such as a picture, a note from the person, something the person has given us, a song that both of you like, or even thoughts about the person.) Say: *The Blessed Sacrament, blessings, and Benediction are examples of reminders that Jesus is always present with us.*

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Page 213 Jesus Teaches Us to Listen to Him

Take turns reading aloud the paragraphs and Scripture in **Jesus Teaches Us to Listen to Him** on page 213. Discuss the feelings conveyed by the imagery in Jesus' parable. The house on rock feels strong, protected, and secure. The one on sand feels unstable and insecure. Listening to Jesus' words and acting on them helps us feel stable and secure. Share with each other ways you and your child have recently built your houses on rock by acting on Jesus' words.

Have your child close his or her eyes as you read aloud **A Moment with Jesus.** Allow your child a moment to talk silently with Jesus.

Pages 214-215 Jesus Speaks to Us at Mass

Take turns reading aloud **Jesus Speaks to Us at Mass.** Call attention to the terms *Liturgy of the Word, Epistles, Lectionary for Mass,* and *Homily* that appear in blue. Have your child read aloud their definitions in the **Words to Know** box. Ask your child if, when you attend Mass together as a family, he or she can tell when the Liturgy of the Word is beginning and how he or she knows. Ask if he or she knows what will come next as he or she listens during the Liturgy of the Word.

Have your child read aloud the directions to the activity **Participating at Mass** on page 215. Work cooperatively with your child in completing the activity by taking turns reading aloud the sections of the activity and saying or singing the responses together.

Page 216 Chapter 24 Review

Help your child complete the **Chapter Review** on page 216. Discuss the questions under **We Remember**. Pray together the psalm verse in **We Respond**. Review the **Words to Know** in this chapter. Have your child read aloud the directions for **Your Turn** and write his or her description. Invite your child to read it aloud to you and affirm his or her response.

If you wish, have your child undertake the **Interactive Chapter Review** by scanning the QR code on page 216.

Read aloud the question and possible answers in **Test Your Catholic Knowledge.** Have your child answer the question. [ANSWER: a book of all the readings for Mass.] Say: *The* Lectionary *provides the readings for every day of the year.*

A CATHOLIC TO KNOW

Read aloud **A Catholic to Know** on page 218. Say: **One way you can be like Bede is to take delight in learning and try your best in school.** Give your child a high five.

Read aloud the **Witness and Share** introductory text. Then read aloud each faith statement in **My Way to Faith**, pausing after each one for reflection.

SHARE YOUR FAITH

Have your child read aloud the directions to **Share Your Faith** and complete the activity. Invite your child to share his or her ideas at your next family meal.

Have your child read aloud the chapter title on page 219, **The Eucharist Is a Gift.** Take turns reading aloud **Gifts Show Love.** Share with each other how a gift each of you has given to the other was filled with love. Share how each of you felt the other's love in receiving this gift.

Page 220 We Offer Our Gifts with Jesus

Take turns reading aloud with your child the paragraphs and the excerpt from the Eucharistic Prayer in **We Offer Our Gifts with Jesus** on page 220. Encourage your child to open himself or herself to truly feel Jesus' presence the next time you attend Mass together.
